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Current scheme update



- Launched on 28 November 2011
- Over 600 applications and 100 accreditations
- All technologies represented apart from deep geothermal
- Rate of applications is around 20 per week
- Significant issues with standard of applications
- Installation of metering causing most problems
- 24 GSHP applications and 2 accreditations

GSHP issues



- Naturally occurring requirement
 - What is renewable from Commission perspective?
 - What do we want to support?
 - Is there a practical solution which we can implement?
- Demonstration of COP
 - Current and future requirements
 - Auditing
- Tariffs
 - Technology costs, efficiency and load factors

Recent developments



- Standby budget management mechanism announced on June 11
- Expected to be in place in the next 3 weeks
- Would suspend the scheme if we forecast spend of £70m for this financial year
- Scheme would reopen next financial year
- Will publish weekly updates of forecast spend
- Expected spend for this year £42m





- Longer-term budget management (e.g. contingent degression)
- Emissions limits for biomass boilers
- Biomass sustainability
- Improvements to regulations, including:
 - Simplifying metering arrangements
 - Addressing the issue of which heat sources are eligible for GSHP

Future consultation - September



- Inclusion of single domestic installations including detailed proposals on tariffs and eligibility
- Proposals for dealing with SPF at all scales
- Consideration of further technologies:
 - Direct air heating (furnaces, kilns, ovens etc.)
 - Air source heat pumps
 - Bioliquids
- And of dedicated tariffs for:
 - CHP
 - Deep geothermal
 - Biogas combustion >200kW
- Call for evidence on GSHP tariffs though welcome evidence before then
